

COMPILING THIS GUIDE

To enable communities to understand the principles and positions that will guide them in their new term, we also asked all candidates to answer questions covering a wide range of education issues so you can understand how they will govern.

We did not edit any individual's answers although a word limit was given.

Some candidates up for re-election are returning to their school boards because they had no challenger and therefore no election.

All candidates were given the same opportunity multiple times to respond to the survey. Several candidates provided no contact information to be included.

Hire the superintendent, who oversees administrators and educators.

Hold superintendent accountable for student outcomes.

Ensure the district's financial health and proper allocation of millions of public dollars.

Ensure effective execution of the strategic plan with clear and measurable goals

Be responsive to the interests of the community - families, taxpayers, and educators

Voting in School Board Elections



Who Can Vote

- A U.S. citizen and Delaware resident
- A resident of the school district
- 18 years of age on or before day of the election

You do not need to be a property owner or be registered to vote

ID Required

Bring one of the following forms of identification:

- State-issued photo ID
- Utility bill
- Any government document with voter's name and address

School Board Election: Tuesday, May 14 Polls open 7 am - 8 pm

Tips to Vote Wisely

Go to your School District website to learn what the School Board discusses at its meetings.

Attend candidate forums.

Consult your local newspaper.

Use this guide to learn about the positions of school board members on key education issues.

Where to Vote

Polls are open from 7 am to 8 pm. on Tuesday, May 14. You can vote at any listed location within your school district.

To find your polling place:

- 1. Go to the <u>Delaware Department of Elections School Board website</u>: https://elections.delaware.gov/school/
- 2. Scroll down until you've found your school district, click it, and you'll see the polling places for your district.

Absentee Voting



If you can't vote in person on Election Day, you may be able to vote by absentee ballot based on one of the reasons noted in the application for an absentee ballot. You do not have to be registered to vote in school board elections.

You must request your absentee ballot by Noon, Friday, May 10.

Important Deadlines

Noon, May 10: request ballot

8 pm, May 14: ballot received

To Return Your Ballot:

Complete, sign, and return your ballot to arrive by 8 pm on Tuesday, May 14 (Election Day).

You can return your ballot by mailing the ballot or dropping off the ballot at the Department of Elections office in your county.

School Board Election Overview



All 17 School Board Districts have seats up for election every year. All eligible voters in a school district can vote in all races for that district, regardless of nominating district. Where only one candidate is running for a school board seat, the Department declares the candidate elected and does not hold an election for the seat. Elections for contested seats will be occurring in the following districts:
