An Evening with Stephen Moore

If you're paying attention, you're feeling a pinch when you purchase just about anything. Most Americans feel that very same pinch too. Only a few short years ago, under the Trump administration, we had peace, prosperity and opportunity. Now, due to the incompetence and Democrat policies from the Biden administration, we have chaos, hardship and adversity. In support of his spirited speech, he brought along slides proving something we all know – life was better under Trump and worse under Biden.



As an economist, Mr. Moore is all about numbers and numbers don't lie. Things really were better under Trump and here are some key takeaways from Mr. Moore's speech:

- 1. Over the first 30 months of the Biden presidency, gasoline is up 35.4%, tax preparation is up 32.2%, motor vehicle repair is up 31.3%, used cars and trucks are up 30.2%, airline tickets are up 26.1%. Eggs, bread and coffee are up 26%, 24.3% and 19.8% respectively. Milk is up nearly \$1.00 per gallon and chicken breast is up over \$1.00 per pound. These increases affect every American.
- 2. The Biden Administration spent an additional \$4+ billion on the Blue State Bailout, Green New Deal/Infrastructure, Corporate Welfare, Schumer-Manchin and unpaid for veterans benefits. More money for more boondoggles.

All 6 got it wrong as inflation continued to rise. That said, it has declined a little of recent...but inflation is still much higher than inflation under Trump.
- 7. Supply side economics does work lower tax rates increase revenues. When companies keep more of their profits, they are incentivized for expansion, higher levels of production and higher production capacity. Also, when companies produce more, they hire more, driving up wages.

8. Trump's energy policy led us to be the top oil producer, beating out Russia and Saudi Arabia thus driving the prosperity we enjoyed. Our current oil production is now much lower and we are experiencing the consequences. The Democrat objective is to eliminate US oil production by 2035.

9. China is the top coal producer by nearly 4 times the amount as the number 2 producer, the United States. While the United States is experimenting with expensive and unreliable "green" energy, China is focused on world dominance using cheap, reliable energy like coal.
